



## **Would Build Shrine To Esquimalt Heroes**

### **Residents Give Support to Proposed Erection of Memorial in Honor of Soldiers and Sailors**

The proposal to erect a "war shrine" in memory of the Esquimalt soldiers who have entered the army or navy during the present war is meeting with general support throughout the municipality, and a public meeting to discuss the details of the proposition will be held within the next few days.

The matter was considered at some length at a meeting held Tuesday night at Heald's Hall, Esquimalt, and the following committee was appointed to ascertain the sentiment of the residents regarding the plan: Rev. W.W. Bolton, Rev. Father J. Silver, Rev. Robert Hughes, Capt. A. Mulcahy, Messrs. T.H. Slater and S. J. Heald, Miss Pooley and Mrs. Nelson.

The cost of erecting such a memorial, it is said, would amount to \$300, and it is believed by those supporting the movement that this sum can easily be secured through public subscription. The shrine would be of white enamel, the names inscribed in black characters, while receptacles for flowers would be affixed. It would be in the form of a triptych and about 14 feet in height. It has been suggested that its location be near St. Paul's Naval and Garrison Church.

## **To Preserve Memory of Esquimalt Heroes**

**War Shrine to Commemorate Their War Service Will Be Erected  
Immediately--Contributions Asked.**

Residents of Esquimalt, at a meeting held in the Rex Theatre last night, decided unanimously in favor of the immediate erection of a war shrine, commemorating the men that have gone forward from their municipality to fight on land or sea in the present war.

A start will be made at once in building the shrine, which will be an imposing affair, 14 feet high, constructed of wood with a heavy coating of white enamel. It will stand in the northwest corner of the grounds of St. Paul's naval and garrison church. The front section of the shrine will contain seven panels, the centre one being for the names of those who have given their lives for their country, and the outside ones for those who have enlisted and have been on active service during the war. Below will be placed receptacles for flowers, while above will be a crucifix, under which will be inscribed: "Greater love hath no man than this he gave his life for his brethren." At the foot of the panels will be inscribed on a single panel the names of the donors.

Reeve Coles was chairman of the meeting, and about fifty persons were in the theatre, the principal address being given by Rev. W.W. Bolton, who explained the nature and purpose of the war shrine. Reeve Coles and Mr. Bolton, together with an architect who is anonymously rendering his services free, will form a committee to hasten construction, and a general committee composed of members of the Esquimalt clergy, Red Cross, and other patriotic societies will attend to the other details, such as the securing of names for the honor roll, and caring for the shrine after it has been completed.

### **Public Will Subscribe**

The cost of the shrine is set at \$250, the lumber and painting being furnished at special rates, while the designing is to be done gratuitously. The money will be raised by public subscription, and Reeve Coles told *The Colonist* last night that donations of any amount, from 5 cents upwards, would be welcomed by the committee. Circular letters will be addressed to every resident of Esquimalt, asking for a contribution, and it is expected that by the time it gets fairly under way there will be no lack of funds. The shrine will be finished in about two months, it is estimated.

There are 150 names already to be placed on the roll of honor, and it is believed that there are fully another 100 more. Arrangements will be made so that names can later be added as found necessary."

## ESQUIMALT TODAY

General Leckie Will Draw Apart Union Jacks Covering Memorial Tablet at St. Paul's Church This Afternoon

At 4 o'clock this afternoon Major-General R.G.E. Leckie, C.M.G., will unveil the war shrine erected in the grounds of St. Pauls' Naval and Garrison Church to commemorate Esquimalt's sons who have joined the army or navy for active service.

The ceremony will be brief and simple, but should be expressive of its purpose. Hymns will be sung during the service, led by a volunteer choir under the direction of Mr. Joseph Hinton, organist of St. Paul's Church, and prayers will be offered by Rev. W. Baugh-Allen, rector of the church.

### Victorians Welcomed

Following the drawing apart of the two Union Jacks, which now shroud the memorial tablet, by General Leckie, Rev. W.W. Bolton will speak on the "The Meaning and Teaching of a Shrine." This will be followed by short speeches from other representatives of the clergy. The aim of the committee is to have the ceremony as informal as possible, and the people of Greater Victoria are invited to attend. The event, it is hoped, will in no way be confined to Esquimalt, and it remains with the public to make it an impressive exhibition of the love and admiration felt for those who have gone forth to fight and, perhaps to die.

Many letters have been received from the front, telling how interested the Esquimalt boys in the trenches are in the war shrine being erected in their honor. The account of the unveiling will be read with pride by thousands of soldiers "out there." There is always inspiration in numbers, and not only will the committee feel that its labor is appreciated, but the men will be assured, if there is a large attendance today, that whatever their city can do to show them honor is done with readiness and enthusiasm.

### First Shrine in Canada

It will be a unique function, for this is the first war shrine that has been set up outside Great Britain. In England bishops and great men of the state count it high honor to take part in the unveiling of these memorials and crowds gather in the streets even to the blocking of traffic for the while. From all accounts the Esquimalt shrine is dissimilar to any other in size. Since the initial design was made it has grown and widened to afford space for the inscription of 400 names. It now stands fourteen feet six inches above the sidewalk, and spreads some seven feet across. Its beautiful proportions have been commented on by everyone who has seen it develop under the name painter's hands.

## Gen. Leckie Speaks at Esquimalt Ceremony

## **Crowd Cheers as Major-General Leckie Parts Flags Shrouding Esquimalt's War Shrine**

"Esquimalt's war shrine, commemorating the 400 or more men and women from that district who are serving, or have served, their country in the present conflict, was unveiled Sunday afternoon in front of St. Paul's Naval and Garrison church before a crowd of close to a thousand people.

Not only residents of Esquimalt were in the throng that faced the shrine during the impressive ceremony. All sections of Victoria and the surrounding community were represented. Many were relatives of those whose names were inscribed on the shrine, a fact which made the service doubly touching. While the proceedings did not begin until 4 o'clock, for half an hour before that time the street was lined with motors and so closely packed was the assemblage that street cars had difficulty passing. The supply of programmes, on which were printed the hymns for the occasion, proved entirely inadequate and was soon exhausted. There was representation from every class of the community and detachments from several military units, including the Royal Canadian Garrison Artillery, the 5th Regiment, the 60th Regiment Highlanders and the Royal Canadian Regiment. A contingent of returned soldiers from the military hospitals at Esquimalt and Resthaven were in attendance, under Major J. S. Harvey, commander of "J" Casualty Unit.

### **Prominent Men Present**

Major-General R.G.E. Leckie, C.M.G. the G.O.C., who, himself saw months of service in France with the Canadian troops, unveiled the shrine. With him on the platform in front of the church, just beside the imposing shrine, draped with two great Union Jacks, were Rev. W. W. Bolton, the originator of the idea to immortalize the service of Esquimalt's sons and daughters by the creation of a shrine; Reeve Arthur Coles, rev. W. Baugh-Allen, rector of St. Paul's church; Rev. Robert Hughes, of the Esquimalt Methodist Church; Rev. Father Silver, of the Roman catholic Church; Capt. and Rev. Dr. J. Campbell, chaplain to the forces; R.H. Pooley, M.P.P. for Esquimalt; Jr. B. Boggs, president of the British Campaigners' Association, were also present.

The singing of 'All People that on Earth do Dwell' opened the function, this being followed by the delivery of two collects by Rev. Baugh Allen, one invoking divine blessing on the shrine, while the other was a prayer for the soldiers serving on foreign soil and those that had fallen in battle. The Lord's Prayer preceded a brief speech from Major-General Leckie, who said he counted it a great honor to be asked to officiate. He observed that some of the names were of those who had already given their lives. Others were of men still fighting, while still others had come back, wounded or otherwise disabled. In stirring language he congratulated Esquimalt on the number of men it had sent overseas and pleaded that this record should act as a spur to those left behind to do all in their power to hasten the victorious termination of the war. It was only in that way that the sacrifice of the country's sons might not be in vain.

### **Cheers Follow Unveiling**

As he finished his address, the General pulled a cord at his side, which drew apart the flags which shrouded the shrine and the spectators viewed with tear-moistened eyes its graceful lines and the panels containing the names of Esquimalt's sons and daughters who had answered the call. It probably was not until the form of the

monument was exposed that the significance of the event was grasped. The ceremony was accompanied by a spontaneous outburst of deafening cheers and applause, which lasted several moments. The inspiring lines of 'Fight the Good Fight' were sung before Rev. W.W. Bolton spoke on the meaning and teaching of the shrine.

Mr. Bolton said:

**"Great is the privilege to have had a hand, however small, in the erection of the War Shrine. Whate'er we do, however great, and this is but a very humble offering, is all too small to do for those gallant men and noble woman here recorded, who have gone forth to do battle and to brave all suffering and danger that we and those who come after us may live in peace.**

**"We have talked of, we have thought of, and now have raised this shrine, a delightful, joyous labor of love, the first War Calvary, so far as we know, amongst the British people outside of the Isles from whence we came. For over two years they have spread through Britain, and rich and poor alike have found in them their comfort.**

#### **Esquimalt's Honor**

"Great, then, is the honor which has befallen us. We are but a tiny hamlet resting on the waters of the Pacific Ocean, the utmost western boundary of the Empire, a spot unknown to millions of our kith and kin, yet here in the faith and fear of God, we take part this day in a ceremony whose echoes may roll over this whole continent: aye, and far beyond.

"For surely this shrine is but the first of hundreds; ours is the pathfinder. Victoria, when she has grasped their meaning, will cry aloud for one. Vancouver follow suit; across the Rockies they will spread, over the broad Prairies they will be scattered, the Great Lakes shall mirror them in their waters, the cities of the East erect them, till Halifax, elder sister of Esquimalt, shall round the matter off, and Canada become a Land of Shrines.

#### **Befits The Times**

"A shrine has only to be thought of to be carried through. It so exactly befits the times. It befits the times because it so perfectly responds to the great longing, hungering love that is everywhere in the hearts of men and women for those they hold so dear who are bravely standing up against hell let loose.

"Some have said this it is premature; that we should raise it after the war is over. These folks do not understand at all the motive of a shrine.

**"For what is a shrine? What is the object? Why not put up a roll of honor and consider the matter done? Not so. A shrine is a holy place, for it is the place where the two greatest and holiest things in life do meet--love and prayer; and both of these find their source in God.**

#### **The Meaning of a Shrine**

"We know of love, that it is the greatest, of all earthly sentiments. Love is all paramount and ever will be, absorbing, overmastering: love saves life and wrecks life; love reigns supreme.

"And prayer is the outward expression of our entire dependence upon God: it is the ladder that joins earth to heaven. Take prayer from us and where should we be--



'For what are men better than sheep and goats  
That nourish a blind life within the brain.  
If, knowing God, they lift not holy hands  
Both for themselves and those who call them Friend?'

Here then, in this shrine, do love and prayer meet in perfect harmony.

### Love

"Love has created it, love permeates it, love enshrouds it, love exudes from it as fragrance from a rose.

**"Not one of those names there but some one loves them dearly. They are our sons, our brothers, our husbands or our lovers. They have suffered, they have bled; some have given their lives for us.**

'God knoweth we but dimly guess  
The day's long toil, the night's distress  
And all they do and bear.'

"Can we help but love them, and because of our love for them, we must needs partake ourselves to prayer?"

'More things are wrought by prayer  
Than this world dreams of.'

"Like the High Priest of old, we bear them on our hearts before our God, and safely leave them there. We can do no better thing for them.

"This shrine, then, is the meeting place of love and prayer. It is an outdoor church, where amid the rush and hurry of life, we may stay a moment without having to enter doors and walls; and standing, pray for our beloved be they alive or dead.

### Flowers and Prayers

"Those flowers are prayers without words. The laying of them there is a sacred act. They are not placed there by us merely as a sign of love for the dear fellow out yonder, or gone to his eternal home, but they are an offering to God. We give Him of His own, for all nature is His, and he ever delights in the works of His own hands.

"When you bring your nosegays, gorgeous in form and perfume, or humble as the wayside daisy, you are performing a holy act, and though you use no words, flowers have their language which alone is known to God.

### Meaning of Crucifix

"Some have sought the reason why the Crucifix surmounts the shrine.

"A shrine without the sacred figure would be no real shrine.

"The Crucifix is not made to fit the shrine, but the shrine is made to suit the Crucifix. The Crucifix is the outward, visible sign of the shrine's spiritual help. I have said that shrine is where love and prayer do meet, and the crucifix stands as nothing else quite can for those very things. For on Calvary's Mound love was perfected; and through that tragic death alone has prayer its power with God.

"This shrine, then, is on mere roll of honor. We leave that to halls and colleges. This is a sacred, a holy spot of ground, a love's centering, a Bethel of prayer:

'This is none other but the house of God;  
This is a gate of Heaven.'

### **No Need of Dedication**

"And hence there is no need of dedication, of settling formally apart this shrine for its holy purpose. We have unveiled it; we cannot dedicate it, for that silent figure there has dedicated it in words unheard, but more eloquent, as silence oftentimes is, than ever mortal spoke. Was ever love, was every prayer like His?

'Greater love hath no man than this, that a man give his life for his friend.'

'Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.'

"And those names inscribed thereon have dedicated it, for they have had the high honor of following in the Master's steps, some even to the showing of that 'greater love.' He fought and died for justice and for right: Are they not fighting, dying for the same?

### **Faithful Unto Death**

"Right then, indeed, it is that those whose names are inscribed within that golden panel should lie where they do: as it were at their Master and their Saviour's feet, for they, like Him, have been faithful even unto death.'

"I recall those immortal words of the martyred Lincoln when he addressed the multitudes at Gettysburg Cemetery:

" 'In a sense we cannot dedicate, we cannot consecrate, we cannot hallow this ground. The brave men themselves have consecrated it, far above our power to add or to detract.'

"This, then, is henceforth holy ground, a spot where you and I can gather and give God thanks for the noble spirit that sent these men and women forth. Here we may pray for their safe keeping, here we may offer our tribute of affection, here we may shed tears (and who dare say us nay) as we read the name of beloved gone to his last home. Here, too, we may pray that he may go ever forward, ever upward through the many mansions of our Father's house above, till he reach (ever in perfect peace) the fulness of the beatific vision.

### **Climax of Labors**

"And because of all this, I count it joy, myself to have had a hand in raising this memorial to my God for my dear ones and yours. In thirty years and more I have lived among you and have labored both as priest and teacher to do some good to those whom my voice has reached. My working days are well nigh over, and though to some this Calvary may seem a small thing and the scoffer without a heart may pass it by as the antiquated belief of a bygone day, yet to me it is the climax, the crown of my labors, the outward seal that Esquimalt's heart beats with my heart, that I have not lived all these years here without learning the secret of the place, which, without doubt, is this: That love and admiration of the sailor and the soldier, whilst not demonstrative, is

paramount amongst us, and that loyalty to God and the King is of the very fibre of our being."

Women's work in the war, with special reference to the work of Esquimalt women the theme of Rev. Robert Hughes; address, in which he pointed to the fittingness of having Major General Leckie perform the unveiling. He emphasized the splendid service that had been done through the channel of the Red Cross, noting that in their war efforts the women of Esquimalt had set religious denominations aside and were united. He urged them to retain the same high ideals which had marked their activities since the outbreak of war and continue the incentive for unselfish service and the very principles for which their husbands and sons were fighting in the fields of France and Belgium.

#### **Thanks Promoters of Shrine**

Rev. Mr. Bolton spoke briefly a second time, expressing thanks to all those who had assisted in making the shrine an actuality, among them being the architect, who rendered his services anonymously; Lemon, Gonnason & Company, the Melrose Company, and Mr. George E. Myers, who did the lettering, the rector of St. Paul's, and the church committee for the use of the ground on which the shrine stood; also General Leckie. He explained that a subscription list would be opened immediately at the offices of Mr. Arthur Coles, Broad Street, and that additional funds to defray the expense would be secured through the sale of official photographs. He encouraged the taking of as many photographs of the shrine as possible, in order that the idea might spread to all quarters and that it might be widely known how Esquimalt honored her heroes.

The plans and specifications, he added, were also open for reference to any parties contemplating the erection of a shrine in another locality. He pointed out that the charge of the shrine had now passed from the control of the original committee, and he formally transferred it to the permanent committee, consisting of the Esquimalt clergy, the Reeve, and the Esquimalt heads of the Red Cross and Patriotic Aid Society.

#### **Duty is Privilege**

Rev. Baugh-Allen, in taking over the shrine on behalf of the permanent committee, said such a duty was a privilege, and he pledged himself to see that the memorial was properly cared for.

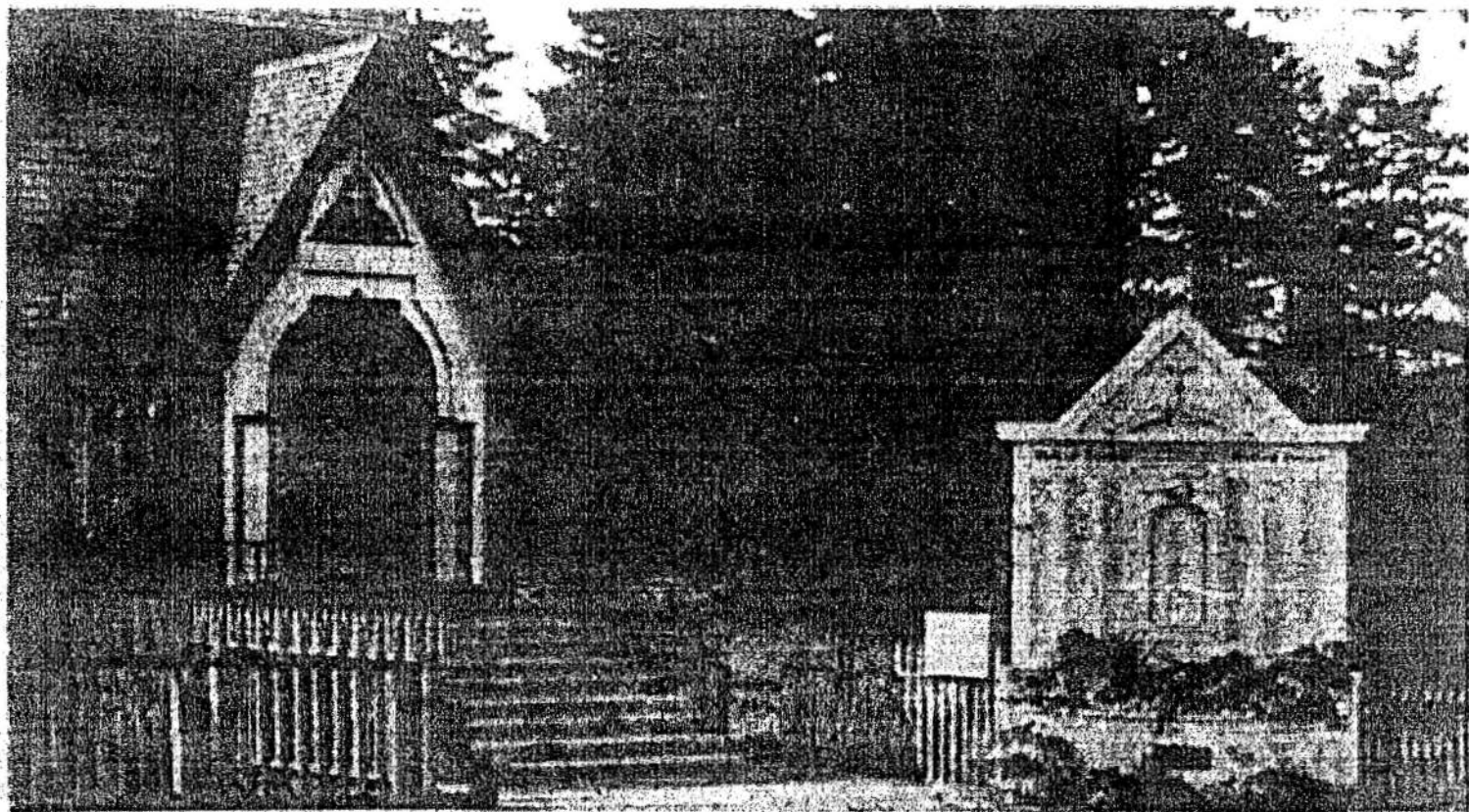
Before the ceremony, which lasted an hour, was brought to a close, "For All Saints" and "O God, Our Help in Ages Past" were sung by the gathering, concluding with the National Anthem.

Twenty dollars was deposited in a subscription box for small individual contributions.

There being some misapprehension as to who is entitled to be placed on the shrine, Mr. Bolton has explained to *The Colonist* that the honor is not restricted to those who have gone overseas, but is the right of any who, having volunteered and been accepted.
