

Greater Victoria Military Museums and Historic Sites

Who They Are, Where They Are and When They Are Open



The British Columbia Aviation Museum is located at 1910 Norseman Road in Sidney. It is on the grounds of the Victoria International Airport on the east side of the airport. The museum consists of two large hangars with aircraft from pioneering days to the jet age, restoration hangar, kidzone, meeting room, library and gift store
 Open: Thu – Mon 10 am to 3 pm



The LGen E. C. Ashton Armoury Museum is located at 724 Vanalman Ave Saanich. Situated in an active Army Reserve Armoury the museum's collections focus on perpetuating the history of the resident combat support and combat service support units.
 Open: Tue, Thu & Sat 9 – noon



Fort Rodd Hill National Historic Site is a 19th-century coastal artillery fort located at 603 Fort Rodd Hill Rd Colwood. The site is adjacent to Fisgard Lighthouse National Historic Site, the first lighthouse on the west coast of Canada.
 Open: Daily 10 am – 4 pm



The Bay Street Armoury located at 715 Bay Street, in downtown Victoria, is home to the:
 5th (BC) Field Regiment (RCA) Regimental Museum
 Open: Tue 7 pm – 9 pm and by appointment
 Canadian Scottish Regiment (Princess Mary's) Regimental Museum
 Open: Tue 9 am – 2 pm Sep – May
 Tue – Fri 10 am – 3 pm Jun - Aug



The Canadian Forces Base (CFB) Esquimalt Naval and Military Museum is located at Naden on CFB Esquimalt, in Victoria. In historic buildings from the 1890s, the museum interprets and displays the history and heritage of the naval presence on Canada's West Coast, and of the military on Southern Vancouver Island.
 Open: 10 am – 3.30 pm Mon-Fri



Fort Macaulay is an 1895 built Canadian coastal defence fortification part of the "Victoria – Esquimalt Fortress" Located in Macaulay Point Park, Esquimalt, the fort, abandoned in 1956, is also known as Macaulay Point Battery dating back to 1878
 Open: Daily Dawn to Dusk
