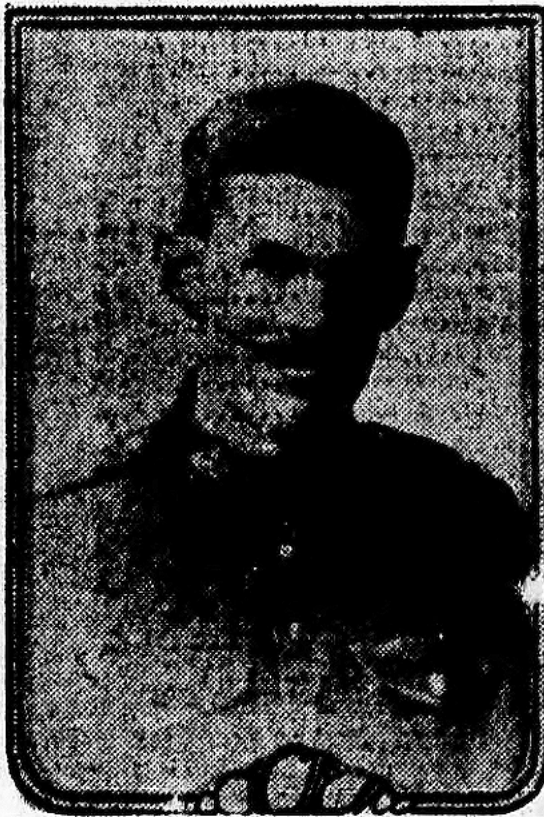


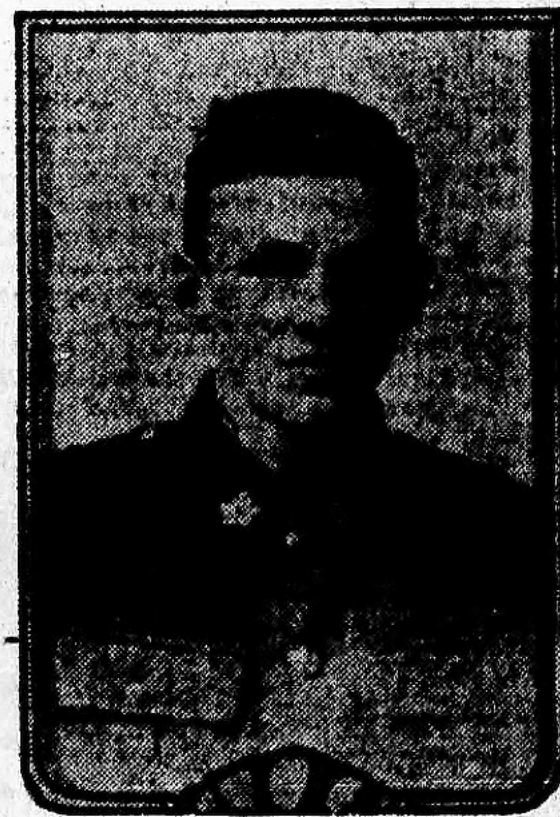
# All of **Zala** Family Have Seen Service

Bandsman A. P. **Zala**, who was recently invalided home, has both his son and two brothers in active service at the present time, and he says that, with himself, these are all the **Zalas** in Canada of military age. His brother, Sgt. Victor **Zala**, was on duty with the 5th Regiment at the Nanaimo coal strike in 1913 and left here with the first overseas draft. He is still with the 1st Battery, C.F.A. The son, Pte. A. H. G. **Zala**, enlisted with the 48th Battalion as bugler at the age of 14 and has seen ten months of service at the front. He has since returned to Victoria. Bandsman **Zala** himself left Victoria with the 88th Battalion and was transferred to the 20th at Shorncliffe. He was taken sick while on duty with the "Canadian Massed Bands" at Paris and is now at the Military Sanitarium, Frank, Alta. A second brother, Sgt. H. T. **Zala**, formerly of the 5th regiment, is taking a course of instruction at Kingston.
